## WHEN TO USE DOUBLE-COURSE OR SINGLE-COURSE SIDING



## The right panel for the right job

Installation expertise is knowing what to install, and how to install it, all while maximizing your bottom line.

Cedar Impressions single-course and double-course siding products are durable and easy to install, allowing you to optimize crew efficiency to keep time—and money—on your side. Plus, they are engineered for interchangeable application, allowing you to offer the 'mix-and-match' exterior design options that homeowners love.

Double-course siding is best when siding large portions of a building Using double-course siding saves time and money when used on large expanses of a house.

Single-course siding is optimal when siding gables and small accents. There is less waste using single-course siding in gables. Use single-course siding when finishing a run on a wall if there is 7 inches or less left to lay siding on.

## Siding Scenario 1

Install Cedar Impressions double-course siding on the bulk of the house.

Install Cedar Impressions single-course siding when coming up to the top of a wall or into a gable using the same color siding

## Siding Scenario 2:

Install Cedar Impressions double-course siding on the bulk of the house.

Install Cedar Impressions single-course siding when coming up to the top of a wall. Use an accent like Cedar Impressions Perfection Shapes in a gable using the same color siding.

## Siding Scenario 3:

Install Cedar Impressions double-course siding on the bulk of the house.

Install Cedar Impressions single-course siding when coming up to the top of a wall. Use an accent like Cedar Impressions single-course siding or Cedar Impressions Perfection Shapes in a gable using a different color


Single-course siding is optimal for accent areas and angular spaces

Due to its size, single-course siding produces less waste than double-course siding in applications that require a lot of cuts-such as gables. It should also be used when finishing a run on a wall that is less than seven inches.

Cedar Impressions Perfection Shapes panels come in scallop, half-cove, and octagon profiles.


Double-course siding is best for large areas without architectural complexity
When it comes to covering large areas, double-course siding is the smart choice. Compared to single-course siding, it installs faster, with fewer fasteners.

Faster to Install

More Coverage per Panel A double-course siding pane covers 4.55 square feet per panel, versus 3.5 square feet per panel for single-course siding - an improvement of $30 \%$ in coverage area.
